She has been teaching image-making courses at The Studio for more than a decade, and her work is in the Museum's permanent collection.

Denise Leone Glass creates original contemporary architectural art glass. Their core values are to inspire, to educate, and to create meaningful, thought-provoking solutions for architectural spaces. By manipulating the optical properties of glass as it interacts with light, they strive to achieve the best possible designs, ones that complement their architectural environments. They are dedicated to design excellence, site appropriateness, and the needs of the community using the space.

Denise Leone Glass Studio specializes in the design, fabrication, and installation of original contemporary architectural art glass. Established by Denise Stillwaggon Leone in 1976, the studio has provided art glass and art glass restoration for public and private spaces, including hospitals, educational institutions, churches, synagogues, and hotels throughout North America and England.

The studio strives to integrate art and architecture by creating art glass that collaborates with its architectural contexts, whether in new or existing constructions.
