BIOGRAPHY

Richard Malinsky is a fine art painter whose work is recognized regionally, nationally and internationally through exhibitions, publications, public and private collections. His lyrical abstract imagery has garnered awards from adjudicated museum exhibitions as well as regional and national art associations.

As a second generation, color based abstractionist, what sets his work apart from Abstract Expressionism is the subtle interrelationship of color and an economy of means - sometimes to a single color field populated by organic forms pushing at the boundaries of the traditional defined rectangle. Beyond the primacy of color, he lyrically embraces the illusion of spacial depth and motion within the confines of a twodimensional surface. Some paintings have evolved beyond pushing at defined boundaries and are a completely free form dimensional reality.
