While working en-plein-air is significantly more challenging than in a studio setting, I find that the work produced is less contrived, and richer in content. Almost all of the studio paintings I execute are done from field work studies.



My landscapes have been juried into numerous regional exhibitions including the Granby Land Trust Art Show (2012 - 2015), the Piedmont cultural exhibit in Somers (2013-2015), and the annual Connecticut Academy of Fine Arts (CAFA) exhibit (2012, 2014, 2015). I am an Associate Artist member of the Lyme Art Association, and an elected member of the Connecticut Academy of Fine Arts (CAFA).
